One of our amazing volunteers, Abel De Casas was called and much to our surprise and joy, he found him.


He then met up with Jaime (our fearless leader) who brought him back to BAS where he was fed and given water and put into a private corral to decompress.



You can start your planning by utilizing some great websites like *dogfriendly.com*, *takeyourpet.com* and petswelcome.com. They can provide you with lists of dog-friendly hotels and inns, along with great travel tips. Whether your plans include traveling by car or plane, there are lots of choices that can make it a fun experience for all of you.

If you are contemplating a plane trip, it is best to contact the airline directly to obtain information on their specific guidelines and requirements as these may vary by carrier.

The Cat's Meon By Cat Mama, Kathleen Paymard

Many people who decide to adopt a cat are thinking of just that – one cat. But lately, more and more people are realizing the benefits of adopting a pair of

bonded kittens. While not every cat likes other cats, most of them do, and cats prefer the company of another cat because they are very sociable animals. Let's look at why this a good idea.

A single kitten alone requires more effort to keep it busy, safe and happy because it gets easily bored and will chew, climb, scratch and tear up things in its effort to keep busy. This is especially true if you work and the kitty is alone in the house all day. Having another kitty to play with shifts the kitten's focus to the other cat so it will be more likely to chase and play with the kitty instead of getting into other things. Since cats are more active at night, two kittens may chase each other, whereas one kitten alone may be pouncing on your toes while you try to sleep. Besides playing together, they groom each other and snuggle when they sleep. Some people erroneously think that if they adopt a pair of kittens they will love each other more and their people less. This is the opposite of what happens - they become more loving, secure kittens when they go into a new home with their best friend. Kittens are part of a litter and they learn proper behavior by interacting with their siblings. If one bites too hard, the other may swat or cry out, letting it know the behavior is not appropriate. This results in better social skills.

Many of our dogs come to us as puppies and wait for their forever home. Some take longer than others. Here are a few that have been waiting for quite a while.














deformity or lack of calcium which has him waddling a little when he walks. He does not appear to be in any pain and it doesn't seem to bother him...so we won't tell him.


